

8-Phrasal verbs

Phrasal verbs are verbs that consist of two or three parts,
i.e., verbs that are combined with adverbs or prepositions that give new meanings.

For example:

Lie down give up look for

Phrasal verbs are of four types:

8-1-Phrasal verb without an object.

Example:

-The fire went out.

8-2-Phrasal verbs that can be separated by an object.

Example:

-She tried on the red dress.

-She tried the red dress on.

8-3-Phrasal verbs that can not be separated by an object.

Example:

-John is looking after the children(correct)

Not:John is looking the children after(incorrect)

8-4-Phrasal verbs with three parts.

Example:

I can not put up with this noise any more.
